**Monday 15th** - Please send in any clean, good quality uniform that your children have grown out of or longer need. If possible, please send this in a bag, labelled by size. **From Monday onwards, children do not need to come in uniform.** This includes PE days, when anything sporty (or easy to run around in) is fine to wear.

**Tuesday to Friday** (or as long as stock lasts) - All donated uniform will be available for FREE at the start and end of each day, on the infant yard. If the weather is bad, we will move the tables inside the hall.
